GOSPEL REFLECTION

Today, this Scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing.

The Gospel scene recalls the First Reading. Like Ezra, Jesus stands before the people, is handed a scroll, unrolls it, then reads and interprets it. At this early time in his ministry, Jesus declares that Isaiah's prophecy is fulfilled in Him. This is perhaps the shortest but most important sermon ever preached! The Gospel, literally "the Good News," which Isaiah announced and Jesus fulfilled, is meant for all, especially the poor. In its most fundamental sense, the poor means all those who know their need for God, who are called by Jesus the "poor in spirit." The self-sufficient, proud or arrogant, on the other hand, have little or no room for the saving Word of God.

Jesus' ministry will include bringing glad tidings to the poor, release to captives, healing to the sick, freedom to the oppressed, and proclaiming a year acceptable to the Lord. The "year of the Lord's favour" is a reference to the Jewish tradition of Sabbath years and jubilee. A year of Jubilee was celebrated every fiftieth year, the conclusion of seven cycles of Sabbath years. It was a year of renewal in which debts were forgiven and slaves were freed. As proclaimed by Jesus, the 'release' in question refers in first instance to God's 'release' of human beings from the 'debt' of sin – though this does not mean that the original social justice sense is excluded.

The text comes to a climax with the announcement of a year of the Lord's favour: the unconditional 'welcome' or 'acceptance' into the hospitality of God, with all burden of sin simply cancelled. This unconditional offer of forgiveness stands behind all that Jesus will say and do throughout his ministry. The 'year' or 'day' of acceptance will become very long indeed, stretching beyond Jesus' own life to extend, through the ministry of the Church, till the end of time.

Through this text from Isaiah, Jesus announces God's salvation. And yet in Jesus, something new begins. Jesus not only announces God's salvation, he brings this salvation about in his person. Jesus is Yahweh's Anointed One, filled with the Spirit of God. Jesus will send the Holy Spirit so that the Kingdom of God can be fulfilled.

When we do what Jesus did—bring glad tidings to the poor, liberty to captives, healing to the sick, and freedom to the oppressed—we serve the Kingdom of God. (Excerpts from: *My Catholic Life; Scott Hahn; Fr. Brendan Byrne, SJ*)
