

## **GOSPEL REFLECTION**

#### "My sheep hear my voice."

Today's Gospel reading is Jesus' answer to the question, "Are you the Messiah?" Jesus responds by saying, in essence, "If you have to ask, then you are not one of my sheep." We may be less familiar with the metaphors of sheep and shepherd than those to whom Jesus spoke. The image of Jesus as Good Shepherd and the community of followers as his sheep has endured over the centuries as a primary image in our faith tradition. Its power to describe the relationship between Jesus and his followers transcends direct experience with sheep. The image speaks to us about the protection, security, and care that shepherds represent for their sheep.

Prior to this passage, some of the Jews were trying to trap Jesus in His speech. They asked Him, "How long are you going to keep us in suspense? If you are the Messiah, tell us plainly." To that, Jesus responded, "I told you and you do not believe." Jesus answered this way because the people questioning Him were not really interested in knowing whether He was the Messiah. Instead, they wanted evidence to accuse Him of blasphemy. But Jesus tells them that He already told them Who He was through His works: "The works I do in my Father's name testify to me."

Do you see the works of God in your life? If you do, then you understand that Jesus' works are one of the primary ways that He speaks to you and leads you as your Shepherd. Among the many works of God in your life is the work of grace by which God enables you to grow in virtue. Therefore, it is important to look for the ways that supernatural virtue grows in your life. The discernment of the will of God enables us to hear His voice and follow Him. And one of the best ways to discern the will of God is to look for the ways that God is touching your life. Where you see virtue increase, the will of God is present and is calling you to grow in that area. Conversely, if there is something in your life that leads you to sin, and, thus, a decrease in virtue, then this is also God's voice telling you to avoid these things.

In the First Reading, the lectionary continues the sequence begun on the Second Sunday of Easter presenting 'snapshots' of the life and mission of the post-Easter church. Here it would be important not to interpret the account of Paul and Barnabas at Antioch in Pisidia in an anti-Jewish way. It is only a minority of Jews who make trouble and cause Paul and Barnabas to turn to the pagans. But in so doing they are fulfilling the destiny of Israel to be 'a light to the nations', according to the prophecy of Isaiah. (Excerpts from: Loyola Press; My Catholic Life; Fr. Brendan Byrne, SJ.)
