#### **GOSPEL REFLECTION**

## *"...rejoice that your names are written in heaven."*

We notice how the readings of this Sunday's liturgy resound with joy and peace. The Openina Praver. the First Reading and the Psalm all speak of this joy, which has been with us in the liturgy throughout the Easter season and now overflows here into Ordinary Time. It is the joy that the disciples experience when they see the Risen Christ. It is the joy that Christians experience when we celebrate the Eucharist. When the seventy disciples return from their journeys, they are rejoicing because their mission has been successful. Demons were under their power because of Jesus' name. Jesus may have sent them out as lambs among wolves, but at the conclusion of this passage he assures them that they have been given power over the enemy and nothing will harm them, not even serpents and scorpions.

A key theme of today's and last Sunday's Gospel is discipleship—its challenges, its difficulties, and its rewards. Sharing in the mission of Jesus is difficult, but everyone is called to do it, not just some professionals trained for ministry.

The loving design of our God always includes the participation of the human family in bringing about God's work of salvation in Jesus Christ. In other words, we human beings form a body that receives redemption as a family or community. We perhaps often forget this and think of redemption more in very personal terms, as "working out my salvation," or my "getting to heaven," without regard for the larger family to which we belong as humans and believers in the one God. Salvation in Jesus Christ is a gift of our God to the entire human race. As Jesus went about from town to town, he likewise sent his disciples to announce that the kingdom of God is at hand. The Lord continues to call us in our respective vocations to do likewise.
