#### **GOSPEL REFLECTION**

"I came to bring fire to the earth..."

The image of fire in this week's Gospel has several meanings. Among them, Jesus uses the image of fire to describe the demands of discipleship. The fire He has come to cast on the earth is the fire that He wants blazing in each of our hearts.

We hear a reference to chapter 3 of Luke's Gospel when John the Baptist tells the crowd that he is baptizing with water, but someone mightier is coming who will baptize with the Holy Spirit and fire. Baptism, in today's Gospel, does not refer to the sacrament but rather to the ordeal Jesus would suffer at the hands of those who rejected him and his message. In his desire ("how I wish") to ignite this blaze, Jesus knew that he was to be the crucible whereby all of humankind would be judged, purified and refined. His baptism will be the conflict into which he will be immersed as he approaches Jerusalem and his death on the cross. The "fire" of which He speaks is also His purifying fire of mercy that He poured forth from the Cross as He offered His life for the salvation of the world.

By the radical nature of his person and his message, Jesus' presence among humankind necessarily demanded a choice. There is no abstention from this choice. Those who accepted him and believed would be set at odds with those who rejected him and remained without faith. We also were baptized into His death (Romans 6:3) and, as Jesus' followers, will not be spared our own ordeals. However, in our struggle against sin, we have not yet resisted to the point of shedding our own blood, Paul tells us in this week's Epistle. We have not undergone the suffering that Jeremiah endures. Jeremiah's suffering prefigures Christ in his Passion. But Jeremiah does not face death: he is raised up from the well. So, by His Cross, Jesus has lifted us up from the mire of sin and death.

Our discipleship does not bring peace in the false way that the world proclaims peace. It means division and hardship. It may bring us into conflict with our own flesh and blood. We don't expect to hear such difficult words from Jesus. But it is good to be reminded that the decision to do the right thing, the good thing, is not always easy. In our own hardship, we remember that Christ is our true peace. (Excerpts from: Scott Hahn; Loyola Press; National Catholic Reporter.)
