GOSPEL REFLECTION

"God has looked favourably on his people!"

All Souls' Day is focused on remembrance of and praying for those who have died, but there is no Gloria or Creed sung at Mass today. This accords with the somber character of the day, as we recall all the deceased, known to us or not, who may not yet be experiencing the fullness of the Beatific Vision before God's Throne. These we usually call the "souls of the faithful departed."

We believe that we continue to share a relationship with those who have died. When we pray for the souls of the faithful departed, we are praying for those whose souls are journeying through purgatory, being prepared for eternal life in heaven. We believe that our prayers for them will help to speed their journey to eternal life with God in heaven. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church defines Purgatory, all who have died in God's grace and friendship, but lack the needed purification to fully enter into God's presence, are assured of their eternal salvation. After dying, many or most souls must undergo purification to attain the holiness needed to experience the joy of heaven.

Purification of all attachment to sin within our souls is a mercy beyond what we can imagine. Through this final purification, God prepares the holy souls who have died for an eternity of joy. This purification is necessary because God, in His love, does not want any soul to live eternally with even a minor attachment to sin. God wants us all free. The truth is that every sin on our soul, even the smallest one, is reason enough for us to be excluded from Heaven. So Purgatory must be seen as a final mercy from God by which He lifts every burden that keeps us from perfect love, so that our eternity will be one of utmost freedom and ecstasy.

In the Order for Christian Funerals, one of the prayers of commendation ends this way: "May you return to your Creator, who formed you from the dust of the earth. May holy Mary, the angels and all the saints come to meet you as you go forth from this life...May you see your Redeemer face to face."

In his death and Resurrection, Jesus has conquered death for all those who believe in him. (Excerpts from: *My Catholic Life; Monastery of Christ in the Desert.*)

On November 19, 2025, Red Wednesday will be marked across Canada and around the


