## GOSPEL REFLECTION

*"This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased."*

Today's feast marks a pivotal transition from the Old Law to the New. Prior to Jesus' baptism, John's mission was in full motion. With Jesus' baptism, the mission of the Old Testament prophets is fulfilled, and the New Law of grace begins.

Jesus presents himself for baptism not because He is a sinner, but to fulfill the word of God proclaimed by His prophets. He must be baptized to reveal that He is the Christ ("anointed one")—the Spirit-endowed Servant promised by Isaiah in today's First Reading. The baptisms that John performs prefigure Christian Baptism. John baptizes for repentance from sin. In accepting this baptism, Jesus unites himself with all sinners even though he is sinless.

As we reflect on Christ's baptism today, we are invited to consider our own. Baptism occurs only once in our lives and imprints on our souls an "indelible spiritual mark" (see Catechism of the Catholic Church #1272 and 1274). This mark configures us to Christ and signifies our permanent belonging to Him and His Church. It cannot be lost or removed, even by mortal sin.

However, while this character endures forever, the state of sanctifying grace within our souls can be lost through mortal sin. In such cases, the grace of baptism is restored through the Sacrament of Reconciliation in which our souls are once again cleansed and brought back into full communion with God. Marked as members of Christ's Body, we are continually disposed to receive sanctifying grace through the other sacraments, as long as we remain in a state of grace. Baptism accomplishes this disposition, enabling us to participate fully in the life of grace that flows from Christ.

In Baptism, all are anointed with the same Spirit, made beloved sons and daughters of God. Indeed, we are "Christians"—literally "anointed ones." We are the "sons of God" in today's Psalm—called to give glory to His name in His temple.

**2026 Pilgrimage**


